May 3 Primary - Voting and Job Opportunities

Voter registration for the Primary ends on April 4, and Early Voting starts April 5. You can <u>request Absentee Ballots</u> NOW for both the Primary and the November 8 General Election. Contact the Delaware County Board of Elections for more information. **(740) 833-2080**.

The Board of Elections is also in the process of hiring poll workers and seasonal staff to support the Primary. Rob Katula is the recruiter for Democratic workers, his direct number is (740) 833-2096. If you are interested in a more long-term commitment, check out this permanent part-time opportunity for an <u>Election Specialist</u>.

Major campaigns are hiring paid organizers to support statewide candidates. You can find information about how to connect with these campaigns on our website.

In place of a countywide meeting in March, each of our six county regions is planning a gathering to plan how to prepare voters and support our candidates before and after the May Primary. (See PROD information below)

Our party needs a new Secretary. We would like a volunteer to take minutes at the April and May meetings, and a candidate to be elected Party Secretary at our reorganization meeting after the Primary. This position requires a few hours each month, and duties include taking minutes at meetings as well as reporting names of Central Committee members to the Board of Elections/Secretary of State. Parker Scholarship

The Committee has sent information to County High Schools and is accepting applications now. Scholarships are awarded to graduating seniors who are pursuing higher education anywhere. Established in the 1980s with an initial investment of \$10,000, this non-endowed scholarship is funded by our party.

In addition to grade transcripts, extra-curricular student activities, community activities, longterm goals, political activity, and letters of recommendation, the committee has always included a requirement that at least one of the student's parents is a registered Democrat in Delaware County.

This qualification has caused some concern in recent years, and the committee would like to put the emphasis on the student applicant's support for progressive values as a selection criterion. In promoting the scholarship this year, this consideration has been included. The committee is considering removing the party affiliation of parents, since this may not reflect the student's values, but will not take this action for this cycle of applicants.
