After the open vote, we recommend that person to the Secretary of State, who makes the official appointment. As with any elected office, those who attend the meetings of this organization make the most competitive candidates.

Thank you to our many volunteers and financial supporters, and **thanks again** to all our candidates. Democrats in Delaware County were very active in the 2022 election cycle, with great candidates and many hours and dollars devoted to running against the odds. We succeeded in increasing the Democratic share of votes in Delaware County, with our top vote getters achieving more than 40 percent: Tim Ryan, 47%, Tamie Wilson, 46%, Louise Valentine, 45%, Justice Brunner, 44%, and Judges Jamison, Zayas, and Heather Swiger, 43% each.
